We wish to help all patients who come to the surgery. For everyone's safety we ask that no one has alcohol or drugs on the premises. Anyone who is intoxicated will not be seen. No abusive or violent behaviour is tolerated and will be dealt with according to practice policy.

How to get help out of hours.

For home visits and advice out of hours call the Emergency Number in **111**. Your call will be answered by NHS 111 operators who will first take some brief details (name, telephone number etc.) and brief details of the problem. Your needs will be assessed and you will be offered advice or a consultation at an appropriate medical facility.

Registering as a Patient.

Patients who wish to register must present as homeless in Westminster. Once you have completed the forms you will be registered with the practice and offered a health check by the Practice Nurse. Once registered you have the right to see any of our doctors, but you may prefer to choose one particular doctor.

For acute medical emergencies we advise that you attend your nearest **Accident & Emergency Department**.

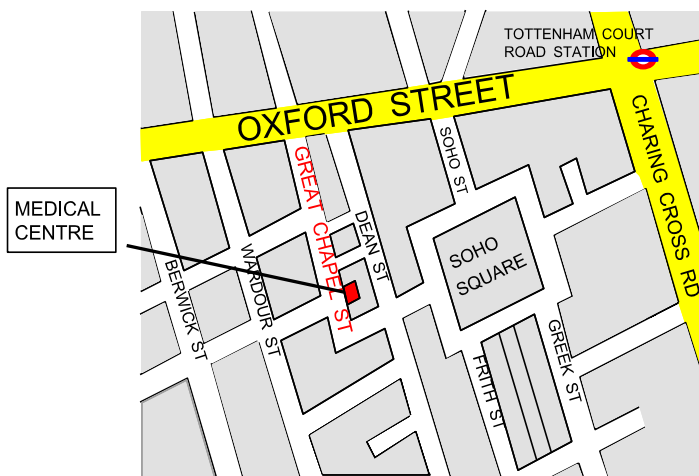
